Educational and Professional Background *(As of 2/1/05)*

Franklin M. Berry, Ph.D. is a psychologist in private practice with offices in Phoenix and Scottsdale, Arizona. He was born in Atlanta, Georgia, spent seven years living in Fort Lauderdale, Florida, and returned to Atlanta following a three-year hitch in the U.S. Army to complete a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Psychology. He then attended the University of Alabama, where he earned his Masters and Ph.D. degrees in Psychology. He became a tenured, full Professor of Psychology in the university system in Georgia. Subsequently he taught at the California School of Professional Psychology in Fresno, and at the Arizona School of Psychology, where he served as Academic Dean. From 1987 to 1988 Dr. Berry then completed a clinical internship at Phoenix Interfaith Counseling in Phoenix, Arizona. From 1988 to 1989 he completed a Post-Internship experience at the Arizona State Hospital.

Dr. Berry entered private practice on a part-time basis in 1989 while also working as a full-time member of the clinical staff of Phoenix Interfaith Counseling, which he did for over fourteen years. He has been working as a full-time private practitioner ever since March, 2002. He completed in-depth training in the use of clinical hypnosis at the Milton Erickson Foundation in Phoenix from the late 1980's through the early 1990's. He also completed a two-year training program in Existential-Humanistic approaches to psychotherapy with the International Institute for Humanistic Studies in California. Finally, he is currently undergoing training related to Personal and Executive Coaching with the College of Executive Coaching in California.

Dr. Berry practices as a generalist. He works with children age five and older, adolescents, adults and elderly adults. His graduate educational experience, his teaching experience, his clinical experience, his continuing educational experience and his personal life experience have been combined and coalesced in his practice of integrative psychotherapy. He accepts most health insurance plans, including Medicare. He limits his practice to psychotherapy and counseling.
